Cool Views of Climate Change

■ “Aqueous,” a small group show downtown, pulls double duty as heat relief and climate change lecture. The exhibition’s photographs, video and painting give sweaty Washingtonians some cooling eye candy: Pools, polar bears and ice caps figure prominently. The strongest work on view examines global water issues: Susannah Saylor’s large-scale photographs of Peruvian glaciers and the aqueducts that serve them suggest that, in the epic battle between man and nature, nature may be losing.
